

Spring 2026 Class Descriptions

20th Century Music History I Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$15

This 8-week class explores 20th-century music history (1900-2000), covering evolution from ragtime/jazz to rock, pop, hip-hop, and electronic. Key topics: genres, artists, cultural impacts. Students should bring a pencil to class.

Advanced Cooking Class High School Grades 9-12 (ages 14-18) \$30

An advanced cooking class for students wanting to shore up techniques and skills in the kitchen to help them feel confident in preparing any recipe or creating their own. Please only choose this class if you seriously want to develop your cooking skills. There are limited seats, so anyone not focused on the tasks will be asked to leave.

All About the Fruits of the Spirit PreK-K (3-5) \$5

Students will be learning about the fruits of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22-23 but taught to their level of learning. Because there are nine fruits, we will talk about two in one of the lessons. There will be fun activities for each lesson or a book or both! Hope to see you there!

Amazing Earth Explorers! PreK-K (3-5) \$15

This class will be a super fun and hands on way of learning about our earth. Each week will be a new theme and we will have an activity that reinforces that theme.

Animal Care Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$10

Care and keeping of animals with a focus on zoology. I hope to take a trip after classes in May to visit the tinker nature center and Seneca park zoo for teen opportunities as my daughter is interested, as well. I will keep you all posted if I have any leads.

Beginner /Low Intensity Gym Grades 1-6 (ages 6-11) \$10

For kids in grades 1-4, and kids in grades 5-6 who are at a beginner level in sports and athletics. We will play games like Freeze Dance, Floor is Lava, and Soccer. We may go outside when the weather is nice. This class will focus on practicing respect, self-control, following the rules of the games, good sportsmanship, and having fun! **Please note: We are arranging the gym classes based on your child's intensity level this session. Please only sign up for this class if your child would most enjoy a chill, non-competitive, fun class environment!**

Beginner Crochet Grades 1-6 (ages 6-11) \$12

This beginner crochet class is a relaxed and friendly introduction to crochet for students from elementary through high school. Students will learn the basics like how to hold a hook and yarn, practice common stitches, and get comfortable with crochet terms at their own pace. The focus is on learning skills and having fun rather than finishing projects, so there's no pressure—just lots of hands-on practice and encouragement. No experience is needed, and students are welcome to explore, ask questions, and enjoy learning a new creative skill.

Beginner Math Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$10

We will be learning and practicing our basic math skills, including an assessment to let me know what level each child is beginning at.

Career Exploration PART 2 High School Grades 9-12 (ages 14-18) \$10

Curious what it's really like to fight fires as a firefighter, design video games, train clients as a personal trainer, work as a park ranger, serve in the military, or help people as a counselor? This isn't a textbook class—it's real professionals sharing their stories.

Every week, two guests talk about:

How they landed their job (most didn't have a perfect plan in high school)

A typical day—the exciting wins and real challenges

Skills and classes that actually mattered

Advice they wish someone told them at your age

Ask anything! 8 weeks of inspiring talks, hands-on insights, and a fun career-themed escape room finale.

Charlotte's Web Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$15

Who doesn't love Charlotte and Wilbur!? We will read this classic children's story of endearing friendship in class throughout the semester. I will read 1-2 chapters each Monday to the class, and then we will discuss it as a class. I will have age appropriate reading comprehension questions. Children will enjoy snacks and activities including a spider craft, learning the parts of a spider, the differences between arachnids and insects, and fun facts about farm life. We'll also talk about friendship – what the Bible says about it, how to be a good friend, etc. Note: Children are not expected to read, I will be doing the reading.

Clay Designers Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$25

In this studio-style class, students will use air-dry clay to design and sculpt fun and practical art pieces with an emphasis on detail and personal style. Classes will feature some instruction, 1 on 1 coaching, and plenty of independent creative time.

Cooking Class Grades 4-6 (ages 9-11) \$25

We will be learning how to prepare a variety of different meals. Please only sign your child up if they have the focus and maturity. A 40 minute class will require good listening to complete our task and be cleaned up. Excessive fooling around will not be tolerated.

Debate Club Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$5

This class will teach kids how to do structured argumentation, critical thinking, and public speaking by researching and discussing various topics. Members will develop skills in forming logical arguments, supporting them with evidence, listening to opposing views, and articulating ideas persuasively.

Elementary Game School Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$5

In Elementary Game School, we will play a variety of board and card games. While playing, we will work on concepts such as cooperation, encouragement, turn-taking, following rules, and having good character.

Girls Beginner Gymnastics Grades 1-6 (ages 6-11) \$10

In this class we will learn tumbling, flexibility, and strength. The girl signing up must have already been in a gymnastics class before this.

Habitat Discovery (1-3) Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$10

We will become animal researchers and discover how animals live and survive in their homes! Each week, we'll explore a new habitat, learning about the weather, animals, food, and special adaptations, and seeing how humans impact nature.

Hand Lettering Open Studio Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$15

Want to practice your hand lettering and use it to create projects? Then join us for a creative class of "studio time" dedicated to the art of beautiful writing. This class is a follow-up to our introductory course, focusing on the practical application of our skills. **

We'll provide some brush pens (feel free to bring your own!) lettering review papers, high-quality card stock and other paper supplies; you provide the creativity! We'll spend our time creating cards, practicing layouts, and refining our personal styles in a calm, low-key environment.

** Students who did not take last year's intro to hand lettering class are welcome to join in, but need to be aware that this class is not step by step instruction, just an opportunity to play and explore with this fun medium

Hands on Structural Engineering Grades 4-8 (ages 9-13) \$18

This structural engineering class introduces students to how buildings, bridges, and towers are designed to be strong and stable. Through hands-on activities and simple design challenges, students will explore concepts like balance, forces, load, and stability using everyday materials. Students will test ideas, learn from what doesn't work, and redesign their structures just like real engineers. The class emphasizes creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving while building a foundation in engineering thinking in a fun, interactive way.

Higher Intensity Gym Grades 1-6 (ages 6-11) \$10

For kids in grades 1-6 who are at a higher level of intensity. We will play games like dodgeball and soccer. We may go outside when the weather is nice. This class will focus on following the rules of the games, good sportsmanship, and having an outlet for higher intensity energy!

****Please note:** We are arranging the gym classes based on your child's intensity level this session. Please only sign up for this class if your child would most enjoy a competitive, hard-working class environment!**

Holiday Crafts Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$10

We will hear a story and make a craft each week for various Spring Holidays, including: St. Patrick's Day, the First Day of Spring, Easter, Earth Day, and Mother's Day.

Imagination Crafting Grades 4-6 (ages 9-11) \$8

During class sessions, children will engage in hands-on creative activities using a diverse range of materials and mediums, including paper, clay, paints, stickers, glue, jewelry-making supplies, crochet, and more. Participants are encouraged to draw upon their own imagination to design and create original pieces. For those seeking inspiration or guidance, a selection of structured project ideas will be provided as options.

The primary focus is to foster creativity, imaginative thinking, and self-expression through open-ended artistic exploration.

This approach supports children's development of fine motor skills, problem-solving abilities, and confidence in their unique ideas.

Jewelry Making For Elementary Level Grades 1-5 (ages 6-10) \$20

In this beginner's jewelry making class students will learn the basics of jewelry making while creating an assortment of beautiful pieces. Such jewelry pieces will include but are not limited to: beaded necklaces, bracelets, rings, string friendship bracelets, ID bracelets, charms, and key chains. This is a nice introductory level class for students 1st-5th grade who would enjoy designing and creating their own jewelry. Materials will be provided by the teacher.

Jewelry Making for Teens Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$20

This jewelry making class is geared for grade levels 7th-12th. It will have a relaxing atmosphere where students will learn the basics of jewelry making. They will create an assortment of beautiful pieces. Such jewelry pieces will include but are not limited to: beaded necklaces, bracelets, rings, string friendship bracelets, ID bracelets, charms and key chains. Learn to Read, Level 1 PreK-K (3-5) \$5

Come along with us as we work on letter recognition and letter sounds using hands hands on techniques. We will also work on reading simple words.

Learn to Read, Level 2 Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$5

Join us as we review the basics of reading and build off of them to read more complex words. We will use a variety of manipulatives and fun activities to practice our reading skills.

Lego creative build Grades 4-6 (ages 9-11) \$12

Each student will use their imagination to design and build a Lego model based on a prompt that changes from week to week.

Lego Robotics (part 2) Grades 4-8 (ages 9-13) \$28

We will continue to use Legos, motors and sensors along with the Lego WeDo 2.0 programming software to make Lego creations come to life. Projects will continue to offer a real world application and will challenge students to use creative problem solving skills to model reality and conduct experiments. Materials will be provided for the class.

Level 1 Strategy Game School Grades 4-6 (ages 9-11) \$5

Game School!!! Join for some game-based learning, an educational approach using games to boost engagement, teach subjects like math/history(and more!), and develop skills like problem-solving, creativity, and critical thinking. It's about integrating play to make learning more effective!!!

Level 2 Strategy Game School Grades 4-6 (ages 9-11) \$10

Teaching strategy boardgames that encourages the use of critical thinking and problem solving.

Level 3 Strategy Game School Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$5

This class will lean into the benefits that games hold for learning logic, multi-step planning and organization, and strategy. Games played will be in the category known as strategy games (ex: Splendor, Ticket to Ride, Star Realms, Pandemic, and Blockus). Please only sign your child up for this GameSchool if they are willing to learn more complex, high school-level games.

Little Chefs: Easy Home Snacks for Tiny Hands PreK-K (3-5) \$25

Join our fun, hands-on cooking class for preschool and kindergarten kids! Over 8 weeks, children will learn to prepare simple, nutritious snacks and mini meals they can easily recreate at home with everyday ingredients. All recipes are nut-free and mostly dairy-free (with easy substitutions like plant-based milk or cheese for allergies). Kids will chop, mix, and assemble under safe supervision, building confidence in the kitchen. No fancy tools needed—just creativity and teamwork!

Music Theory Lower Elementary Grades 1-3 (ages 6-8) \$12

In Music Theory, we will play games and do activities to learn rhythm, note reading, and basic piano skills. Students should bring a pencil to class with them each week to write in their workbooks that they will get to take home at the end of the semester.

My Body (PreK-K) PreK-K (3-5) \$10

Learn about the human body! We will learn about parts of the body and their jobs through a variety of activities including songs, books, and hands on activities.

NeuroQuest: The Amazing Brain Lab Grades 4-8 (ages 9-13) \$20

Dive into the amazing world of the brain! In this interactive class, students become junior neuroscientists as they explore how their minds work through experiments, brain games, creative projects, and fun challenges. They'll investigate memory, focus, emotions, and problem-solving using hands-on activities like sensory experiments, logic puzzles, and art-based explorations. Each session blends science and creativity to make learning exciting, memorable, and truly hands-on. Students who complete the course will proudly earn a Junior Neuroscientist Certificate to celebrate their achievement!

Nutrition PreK-K (3-5) \$5

In Nutrition, we will learn how our bodies work and what nutrients we need. We will discuss a different set of nutrients each week and sample foods that help our bodies stay strong and healthy. Please notify the teacher if your child has any food allergies or dietary restrictions.

Painting Club 1 (Priority given to 4-6th graders) Grades 4-8 (ages 9-13) \$15

The goal of Painting Club is to work independently and let each child's creativity flow onto the canvas!

Physical Science With Labs (Apologia) Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$20

Play & Learn PreK-K (3-5) \$15

This class will have a focus on play learning. Each week will have a "theme" or focused topic that will cover letter association, corresponding book (if theme/topic allows), numbers/counting and an activity and/or easy craft.

Pokemon + Games Grades 1-8 (ages 6-13) \$10

Kids can bring their binders to talk about and trade Pokemon cards each week. We will also have different table games and board games each week for kids to play, such as UNO, Battleship, Monopoly, and Battle Academy. This class will focus on socializing, game strategy, and fun!

Pre-K Music & Movement PreK-K (3-5) \$9

This is a high energy class structured to get the wiggles out! We will move our bodies and learn different simple concepts of music. Students need to bring a filled water bottle.

Show & Tell PreK - Grade 3 (3-8) \$5

Show & Tell is a structured activity where students will bring in a special item from home to present to their peers. This time serves as a vital tool for developing oral language, public speaking, confidence, and social skills like active listening. *Items brought in will include a theme, letter, mystery bag, etc. and will be emailed out prior to start of classes*

Small Animals of the World PreK-K (3-5) \$8

Join us on an adventure to discover some of the world's smallest animals. Each week will highlight a different animal. We will learn where they live, what they eat and other fun facts. Each week we will color a picture to compile into a book to take home at the end of the semester. Crayons and markers will be provided.

Sourdough Class Middle School - High School (ages 12-18) \$20

A hands-on learning approach to sourdough. Touching on the history of different leavening techniques. It is the goal to touch on all aspects of sourdough bread making. Students will create their very own starter from an original batch started hundreds of years ago in the Alaska region. Keeping and caring for the starter is key! Refrigeration slows the process and allows the students time if they don't want to bake bread, everyday, at home. Praying to be a blessing! All materials provided. I am hoping students will take responsibility of their starters and be encouraged to dive into sourdough.

STEM Challenge High School Grades 9-12 (ages 14-18) \$25

This class challenges high school students to apply science, technology, engineering, and math concepts through hands-on design challenges. Students develop collaboration, problem-solving, and critical-thinking skills in an engaging, project-based environment, with team competitions and prizes that motivate excellence and creativity.
